





Next, a CEO Board of Directors was formed and the work began. Community members, businesses and organizations were solicited as Investors. Our list of investors, grew and grew. The Midland Institute for Entrepreneurship offered detailed information about what to do next. Through a year and a half of planning, student applications were taken for the 2015-2016 school year.
